

WINTER WILDLIFE Teaching – Belize, Central America

The Center for Engaged Learning Abroad (CELA) is seeking a wildlife veterinarian to teach a field course on Wildlife health, conservation and biology in Belize. The course, offered from December 26 to January 7, 2019, is given at the Belize Zoo as well as other field sites in Belize and has a local naturalist as a field assistant. The course is also offered several times in the Summer each year.

The interested person will work with the current syllabus, deliver lectures and clinical/field experiences, and assist in overall course management. Classes are small (8-12 students), two weeks in length and the focus is on hands-on experiential learning. The successful applicant will love teaching undergraduate students, relate well to pre-vet and to conservation biology students, be flexible and adaptable, and able to cope with field conditions in a tropical environment. Preference will be given to candidates who have the flexibility to return annually and consider joint research projects with Belizean researchers.

Job Requirements: Current veterinary license; valid driver's license; teaching experience; knowledge of wildlife/zoo animals.

Remuneration: Round trip economy airfare, accommodation and expenses in Belize, temporary vet license for Belize, honorarium.
